The club has made many changes in the past year, including having our meetings on ZOOM once a month at 7:30 pm. Below you will find a summary of projects our club participated in from mid-2020 until now.

Monroe Women's Club Highlights July to December 2020

The Monroe Women's Club took a short summer break before starting a Light the Night for Hope fundraiser for July 25th (Christmas in July). The club sold and delivered paper luminaries & candles to Monroe homes prior to the event. The purpose was to promote home in the community during this time of uncertainty due to the pandemic. Quite a few homes in Monroe participated and many posted photos on social media. The good weather added to the beauty of the evening.

By August, the club started our annual Flamingo Fundraiser to support Swim Across the Sound. Club members would place a flock of pink plastic flamingos near a recipient's mailbox for \$15 for a 2-day stay. Our response to the fundraiser was very good! The fundraiser ended on October 1st, the start of Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

The early fall and the postponement of our annual fundraiser due to COVID opened the door for our Boo Bag Fundraiser – a socially distanced way to remember friends, neighbors and relatives in Monroe with a bag of Halloween themed treats and items. Adult/Teen bags sold for \$20 while Kid's Bags sold for \$15. We purchased black bags and Halloween tissue paper and attached a note saying "You've been boo-ed!" The bags were left secretly & the sender could remain anonymous if wanted. This fundraiser kept us very busy making bags and delivering them all around town. Some of the kids even posted pictures of themselves smiling with their bags on our Facebook page.

With a little quiet before the busy holiday season, we concentrated on projects that helped our fellow neighbors. One member started a Coat, Sock, Mitten, Scarf Drive for Bridgeport Rescue Mission. Another made thirty fruit baskets for residents of an assisted living facility. The club made a monetary donation to Wounded Warriors for Veteran's Day and a Thanksgiving Dinner Donation to Bridgeport Rescue Mission. One member had signs made to say "Thank You to our Essential Workers", which will be placed all around town expressing our appreciation.

For the holidays, we participated in our town's Giving Tree by purchasing grocery gift cards for residents, decorating the town green and getting a tree donated for the Town Green Gazebo. Our annual tree lighting was canceled due to COVID-19, but we took the opportunity to sell beautiful holiday poinsettias, luminaries and mystery gift bags to spread Christmas cheer. We are honored our fallen soldiers again with a donation to Wreaths Across America and helped others around the world with a donation to Heifer International. We are continuing our monthly club meetings via Zoom!

<u>ORGANIZED:</u> The Monroe Women's Club was established on December 1, 1976 and is part of a state-wide non-profit organization of Junior Women's Clubs. Our parent organization is Connecticut Junior Women, Inc. (CJW)

<u>PURPOSE</u>: Our purpose is the promotion of civic interests through cultural, educational and social activities among women.

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: Membership is open to any woman, resident or non-resident of Monroe, age 18 or older, who would like to volunteer her time and talents to serve the Monroe Community. Current membership is 12 members with up to 20 years of club experience.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- Pay Annual Dues of \$30
- Attend Monthly Meetings in person (currently we are using Zoom)
- Support & assist other members with their projects
- Be an active participant!

<u>MEMBERSHIP DUES:</u> Upon joining and paying your club dues, you will receive a Club tote bag. Your dues cover membership dues and insurance through our parent organization, CJW.

<u>MONTHLY MEETINGS</u>: Meetings are held once a month, usually the second week of the month, September through June. Day of the week may vary from Monday to Thursday.

Monroe Women's Club

Our purpose is to promote educational and philanthropic community service and give its members an opportunity for personal enrichment, leadership experience and social interaction. We are a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization.

All our members are volunteers.

The Monroe Women's Club was started in December 1976 by 6 local women who formed the Junior Women's Club of Monroe. In July 1977, the club held a Swim-A-Thon and raised \$8,000 to help open the town's new pool. Around 1979 the club and 73 other clubs from the state of Connecticut left the General Federation of Women's Clubs to become the CT Junior Women's Club (CJW) allowing all clubs to have more voting power and a change in age limitations. As a part of the CT Junior Women's Club, each club in the state contributes to a state project.

The Monroe Women's Club currently has 12 members which includes 5 officers – Co-Presidents, Treasurer, Membership Chair and Parliamentarian. Some officers do double duty as Secretary & Recording Secretary. The club meets monthly (currently via Zoom) and completes several projects during the year. In normal times, the club met once a month rotating members' homes.

- Country Treasures Craft Show (1985-2014)
- Funds to start the Sensation Trail and publishing the Guide to the Chalk Hill Nature Trail (1988-1990)
- Half Ton Sundae: A 75-gallon ice cream sundae in a kiddie pool; individual ice cream cups were sold as a fundraiser
- Take A Stand Lemonade Day: lemonade stands all over Monroe raised money for charity
- Vidbel's Circus: family entertainment on Fireman's Field
- Large donation given to Edith Wheeler Memorial Library to help restore the historical mural by artist David Merrill

Once a year, at the end of May, the club disperses all its funds less than 15% operating costs for the following year. The club has given monetary donations to Project Warmth, Monroe Food Pantry, Monroe Firehouse, Monroe EMS, Masuk High School, EWML, Monroe Scholarship Fund and Monroe Playground Foundation, among others.
